

Lake Hopatcong Trail

Trail rules and regulations

The Lake Hopatcong Trail highlights the natural beauty of the Lake Hopatcong region. It is a cooperative effort between the Lake Hopatcong Foundation and state and local governments and groups. The first phase of the trail begins on the Morris Canal Towpath across from Hopatcong State Park in Landing. It winds through Hopatcong Borough, providing scenic overlooks, as well as access to Lake Hopatcong near Roland-May Eves Inlet Sanctuary, before ending at the Prospect Point Preserve in Jefferson Township.

The Lake Hopatcong Trail includes some new trails, portions of established trails and some roadways. Several miles of the Lake Hopatcong Trail align with the Highlands Trail, which runs for 182 miles, connecting the Delaware River to the Hudson River and is maintained by the New York-New Jersey Trail Conference. Sections that are aligned bear both trails' blazes. The Lake Hopatcong Trail blaze is white with blue printing.

BE SAFE, BE CONSIDERATE, RESPECT NATURE.

- Stay on designated trails; sections of the trail are on private property. Trespassers may be prosecuted.
- For your own personal safety, please stay on the trail while on Hudson Farm property since it is a private sporting club.
- Be courteous; yield to other users on the trail.
- Trails are carry-in, carry-out; refuse is to be disposed of properly.
- Pets must be leashed and controlled at all times; pet waste is to be carried out.
- Do not drop matches or cigarettes.
- Protect plants and animals; don't disturb wildlife and local vegetation.
- Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Observe wildlife from a distance; do not follow or approach them.
- Camping is not permitted.
- Fires are prohibited.
- Alcohol and all illegal substances are prohibited.
- Paintball is prohibited.
- Unauthorized motorized vehicles are prohibited.

Lake Hopatcong Trail


